Registration starts at 12:15 PM (Register to become a registered NWS spotter.)

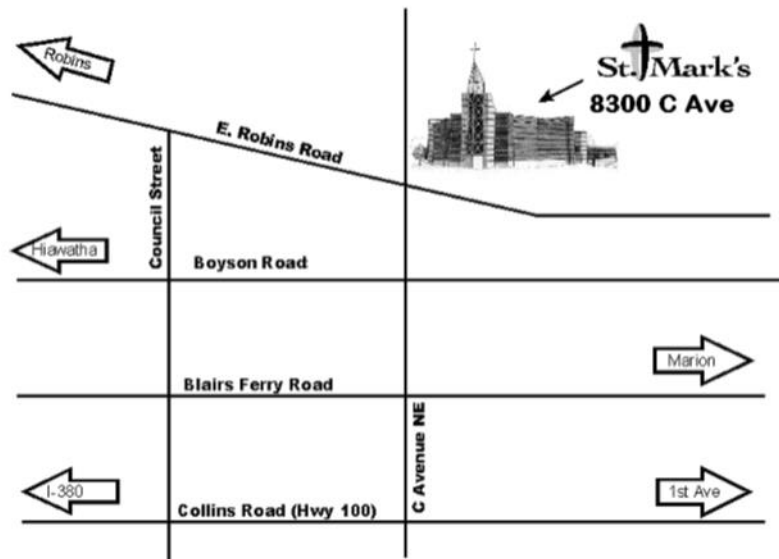
